

Application Guidelines for Incoming I-GFL Exchange Students (2027)

1. About the Exchange Program

Gunma University welcomes international exchange students from its partner universities with which it has student exchange agreements. Students may study at Gunma University for one semester or one academic year.

This guideline is intended for students who wish to participate in the Interdisciplinary Program for Global Frontier Leaders (I-GFL), an English-medium interdisciplinary program that brings together Japanese and international students to learn through collaboration, project-based learning, and real-world experiences. Through I-GFL, students develop leadership, intercultural communication, and problem-solving skills while experiencing Japanese society, culture, and local communities.

Duration	1 semester or full year ○ Spring semester only: April – August ○ Fall semester only: October – February ○ Full academic year: April – February or October – August
Fee	Tuition and application fees are exempted while students remain enrolled at their home university where they pay the tuition fees.
Student learning time	Exchange students are required to participate in a minimum of 10 hours per week of classes or research to maintain student visa status. I-GFL courses and other English-taught courses at Gunma University count toward this requirement. 2. Why choose I-GFL?

- Study in an English-medium program.
- Learn alongside Japanese and international students.
- Explore global issues through interdisciplinary learning.
- Gain real-world experience through local engagement.
- Develop global perspectives and practical skills.

3. Eligibility

- ① Students must be enrolled in their home university as full-time undergraduate or postgraduate students. Students need to leave Japan and return to their home university after completing exchange program at Gunma University.

- ② As an I-GFL applicant, you must meet the English proficiency requirements listed below. Japanese language proficiency is not required for the I-GFL program.

Applicants must demonstrate English proficiency at approximately CEFR B1+ level through one of the following minimum test scores:

- TOEFL iBT (including the Home Edition): 58
- IELTS: 5.0
- TOEIC: 550
- Cambridge English Qualifications: B1 Preliminary, Cambridge English Scale score 160 or above

If formal certification is unavailable, a faculty member at the applicant's home university may provide a written confirmation of the student's English proficiency. Submission is not required for native English speakers or for those who have completed their formal education in English.

4. About the I-GFL Program

The I-GFL program is designed primarily around interdisciplinary subjects taught in English together with hands-on courses and practical learning experiences. Therefore, students can complete the course without Japanese language proficiency.

■ Interdisciplinary Program for Global Frontier Leaders (I-GFL)

I-GFL aims to cultivate "universal skills" that enable students to thrive anywhere in the world, regardless of their field of expertise, in this era of VUCA (Volatility, Uncertainty, Complexity, and Ambiguity). Through classes in which local and international students – regardless of faculty – discuss interdisciplinary themes, and through paired experiences in local industries in Gunma Prefecture, students will acquire the skills to thrive in any setting, transcending national and disciplinary boundaries.

■ Hands-on Courses in Traditional Japanese Culture (Elective) (scheduled for the 2027 academic year)

In addition to the I-GFL curriculum, students may choose the following elective courses in traditional Japanese culture:

Japanese Music (2 classes / 3 hours per week)

Japanese Painting (2 classes / 3 hours per week)

■ Japanese Language Courses (Elective)

Japanese language courses are not required for I-GFL students. However, Gunma University offers optional Japanese language courses for exchange students who wish to learn or improve their Japanese, including courses for complete beginners. Details such as class hours and placement procedures will be provided separately.

5. How to apply

■ Before applying

Please note that we do not accept any applications directly from individual students. Applicants should be officially nominated by their home universities and checked if they meet all criteria.

Gunma University will select exchange students and then inform their home universities. Students are then informed by their home universities.

■ Application instructions

Applicants who have received notification of their decision are required to complete and submit the application materials listed below through the exchange coordinator of their home universities.

The package of documents and the URL for uploading documents will be sent only to students who have been accepted.

- Some documents must be submitted by post. Please allow sufficient time for mailing to Japan.

☐ Application deadline	September 25, 2026	March 26, 2027
☐ Application result	Beginning of December	Beginning of June
☐ Acceptance package arrival (necessary documents for visa applications, housing, etc.)	Middle of January	Middle of July
☐ Recommended arrival dates	End of March	End of September
☐ Semester starts (2026 Academic Year)	Beginning of April (April 9 in 2026)	October 1 (October 1 in 2026)
☐ Semester ends (2026 Academic Year)	Beginning of August (August 7 in 2026)	Beginning of February (February 8 in 2027)

The exact dates for the 2027 academic year have not yet been determined.

The dates in parentheses are provided for reference based on the 2026 academic year schedule.

After receiving an acceptance package, students can start their visa applications at the Embassy of Japan in the country where they reside. Students should not arrange flights or make travel commitments before obtaining their visas.

8. Insurances

All international students, including exchange students, are required to enroll in the following health insurance systems:

- National Health Insurance (JPY 20,000 per year)
- Personal Accident Insurance for Student Pursuing Education and Research and Liability Insurance for Students Pursuing Education and Research (JPY 1,340 per year)
- Comprehensive Insurance for Students' Lives coupled with PAS for International Students (JPY 11,500 per year)
