3. Curriculum

	① KUGF curriculum The purposes of the KUGF curriculum are to improve language proficiency and communication skills, develop a high level of cross-cultural understanding, and foster global leadership skills. The curriculum can be categorized into 2 courses. Please refer to KUGF Course Guide for contents of the courses and language requirements. Global Frontier and Skill Up for Studying Abroad These courses are taught entirely in English and are open to both Japanese and international students. Global Frontier courses consist of 8 Modules. The purpose of Skill Up for Studying Abroad courses is to acquire English language skills. ② Courses for International Students These courses are to support international students with Japanese language studies. We provide various levels of classes, from basic to advanced. You will be taking an appropriate level of Japanese classes after a language placement test done by a Japanese teaching specialist. We offer not only Japanese language courses but also courses that provide basic knowledge on Japan, introduce cultures of Japanese companies, business Japanese and courses that place you in a real company or an organization. ③ Specialist subjects (courses offered by other faculties) Exchange students whose Japanese language ability is sufficiently high as proven on the Japanese language placement tests taken after their arrival in Japan can enroll in classes of these faculties. Students can learn a wide variety of subjects from general cultural subjects to specialist ones through these courses, held in the 14 faculties of Kansai University. Acceptance at Kansai University Graduate School	If students wish to study at Kansai University Graduate School during the exchange program, they will be assigned a professor to provide support for research activities. Students who wish to undertake research at the graduate school must search for a professor suitable for their research theme using the KANSAI UNIVERSITY System for Academic Information and submit a research plan (in either Japanese or English) at the time of application. *Graduate courses may not be opened if there are no regular students to take a course of a relevant graduate school. *Regarding acceptance as a graduate exchange student, acceptance may be refused at the discretion of the professor due to inconsistency in research content, Japanese proficiency, and etc. In that case, please note that students will be accepted as an undergraduate exchange student.

Starting from the 2026 academic year, we will transition to a new academic calendar. Under the current system, all 15 weeks of classes are conducted in person. However, from 2026 onward, the academic calendar will consist of 14 weeks of in-person classes and 1 week of on-demand delivery. The duration of each class will remain the same at 90 minutes per session.

【New!】GTN Assistants for Biz	Starting from the 2026 academic year, our university has decided to introduce the "GTN assistants" for the purpose of enhancing the safety and well-being of international students. All international students will be required to enroll in this service. Through this service, students can access lifestyle consultations and basic medical interpretation via 24-hour chat or phone support. It also provides useful daily life information, emergency disaster updates, and earthquake alerts. Please note that the cost of this service will be borne by the students themselves. 7. Visa Information	
Procedures for Obtaining a Student Visa	Kansai University will obtain a digital Certificate of Eligibility (e-COE) and send it to the student directly. With the e-COE, exchange students can apply for a "Student" visa at the nearest Japanese embassy or consulate overseas.
Permission for Undertaking a Part-time Job	If students apply for work permission, they will be able to work part-time and receive remuneration despite their status as "Student" (please note that they can only work for 28 hours per week). If they are planning to work part-time in Japan, they must apply for work permission.
Status of Residence After Completing the Exchange Program	Even if the residence card is still valid at the time of program completion, students must return to their home country by September 20th for the Spring semester and by March 31st for the Fall semester. Please be noted that students are obliged to hand in the soft copy of their flight ticket for returning home before leaving Japan as well as the invalid residence card after returning home as Kansai University manages international students' status of residence pursuant to Article 19 (17) of the Immigration Control and Refugee Recognition Act and the Notice on Appropriate Acceptance and Registration Management of International Students from the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology. In addition, Kansai Unversity will not support students to change their status of residence other than "Student".

8. Health Insurance and Overseas Travel Accident Insurance

Insurance	National Health Insurance (paid by the student) If you get sick or injured during your stay in Japan, National Health Insurance makes it possible to receive medical treatment by only paying part of the medical expenses (partial obligation). In principle, it is possible to receive medical treatment with the payment of just 30% of the total medical care expenses. Exchange students are obligated to buy the National Health Insurance.		
	Personal Accident Insurance for Students Pursuing Education and Research (PAS) (paid by the University) The Personal Accident Insurance for Students Pursuing Education and Research (PAS) is taken out collectively so that a minimum level of insurance benefits can be received if an unexpected accident or disaster occurs during education or research that results in injury.

	Others Students are obligated to purchase “National Health Insurance (paid by students)” while studying abroad in Japan. “Personal Accident Insurance for Students Pursuing Education and Research (PAS) (paid by Kansai University)” could be applied for curricular activities and injuries that occur on campus. However, the insurance mentioned above may not provide sufficient coverage. Please make sure to purchase insurance (traveler’s insurance) for sickness, injuries, and unexpected contingencies during your stay in Japan. Kansai University recommends to purchase 「Comprehensive Insurance for Students Lives Coupled with “Gakkensai”」 (only international students can purchase this insurance) for international students who would like to purchase insurance in Japan.
